
THE SEASON OF THANKSGIVING

Do you know this tree?

Jatrofa Projenou does and it is planting thousands of them. You may not recognize it, but you've eaten its seed, and it is part of how we are helping families in Haiti farm better and make a better living doing it. It is a cashew tree, Anacardium occidentale.

It is native to Haiti, it adapts well to different kinds of land, it produces food, and it can improve a family's income.



What more could you ask for? I'm glad you asked because that last part is the missing link in the cashew chain that JP has been developing. Currently, we grow thousands of cashew trees in our nursery and families are crazy about planting them and harvesting their fruits, but JP does not yet have the setup that lets families get a much better return when the cashews are sold as a finished product.

Jatrofa Projenou's agronomy team has modeled a feasible method for doing that based on our experience making soap and other products from the Jatrofa tree. Our goal in the new year is to secure the missing link in our cashew chain, so that it can join jatrofa as a crop people can grow to improve their income and security. Everyone on the JP team is thankful for Bethlehem Ministry and sends their love. May a bowl of cashews add to your Thanksgiving table.
